## **ABOUT EDITIONS JOJO**

Editions JOJO began as a self-publishing imprint in 2019 and is currently structured as a partnership, primarily managed by founder Kaamna Patel, and is based out of Mumbai in India. As an institution, Editions JOJO has spearheaded & executed a wide range of projects and currently operates under multiple rubrics.

Since 2020, Editions JOJO has been managing an extensive photobook library out of its space in Mumbai. Today the library hosts over 400 books on both historical and contemporary practices in photography from around the world. The library regularly organises travelling pop-up reading rooms and curated shows around India and internationally, partnering with organisations such as Arthshila, Double Dummy studio, Kanike, amongst others.

'The lab' is an interactive space for cultural production responding to visual culture in South Asia and building bridges from our region to the wider world through dialogue, exchange and pedagogy. Our programs include talks, workshops, lectures and other activities that help activate Editions JOJO's library collection and engage in critical discussions from our region. Notable activities include a YouTube program called 'Between the Sheets' led by photographer and writer Zahra Amiruddin, where artists whose books are part of the Editions JOJO library are interviewed, building an archive of book-readings and conversation. Our podcast 'Glass Eye: A Podcast on Visual Culture from South Asia' has been recently supported by PhotoSouthAsia & Art South Asia Project's Publications grant. As an independent organisation, JOJO supported Riti Sengupta at the Louis Roederer Discovery Award curated by Tanvi Mishra at Les Rencontres d'Arles 2023 with the help of VII Foundation & Atelier Boba.
